The Division of Neonatology and Newborn Medicine in the Department of Pediatrics at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) is seeking candidates for a full-time junior faculty neonatologist position interested in combining laboratory-based research with clinical responsibilities. Protected time, support, and mentoring are available to ensure that the successful candidate will develop a successful, independent basic science research program.

MGH is an academic medical center affiliated with Harvard Medical School. The perinatal program includes approximately 3,700 deliveries/year with an active high risk maternal-fetal medicine service and associated Level II Special Care Nursery and Level III NICU. Our neonatologists help train fellows of the Harvard Neonatal-Perinatal Fellowship Program and residents in the MGH Pediatric Residency Program.

Requirements include an MD or equivalent degree, eligibility for medical licensure in the State of Massachusetts, board certified or board eligible in Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine. Individuals with a record of publications and funding such as a K-award preferred, but we will consider graduating fellows with significant research experience and potential.

Academic appointment at HMS at the level of Instructor, Full-time or Assistant Professor, Full-time will be commensurate with experience, qualifications and achievements.

This position will become available July 1, 2017, and will remain open until filled.
