The Massachusetts General Hospital Disparities Research Unit in the Department of Medicine is seeking a Researcher to serve as a Senior Scientist in the Unit. The Researcher will work in a collaborative, fast-paced work environment and in the context of several large NIH-funded studies. A major focus of the position is authorship and/or collaboration on scholarly publications resulting from major clinical trials and studies within the Unit. This includes conceptualizing and designing research manuscripts, interpreting statistical analyses, conducting quality control of publications for statistical rigor prior to submission, and advising a network of co-authors on research studies. The Researcher will also contribute to the conceptualization and writing of new grant proposals and projects. This includes Unit-wide initiatives as well as independent projects. S/he will help to advise on and troubleshoot on the ongoing conduct of studies currently collecting data as required to ensure success of the Unit's research agenda. S/he will be part of a dynamic multidisciplinary team including psychologists, physicians, public health researchers, health economists, and biostatisticians, and will contribute to the overall success of the research environment.

Qualifications include: Ph.D. with several years of independent research and grant writing experience. Self-starter with excellent organizational, writing and analytical skills. Excellent attention to detail and ability to synthesize and manage data from multiple sources. Supervisory experience and experience working with multiethnic and multicultural populations desirable.

Appointment to Associate Professor at the Harvard Medical School will be commensurate with experience, training and achievements in addition to teaching activities. Suitable candidates will have a Ph.D. and experience in disparities research.
