Junior Faculty Position in Health Econometrics

The Division of Pharmacoepidemiology and Pharmacoeconomics of the Brigham and Women's Hospital seeks a junior faculty member in Health Econometrics to join our growing team.

Applicants should have excellent graduate training in econometrics in healthcare related contexts. A beginning track record in econometrics applied to a specific clinical area such as mental health using data from clinical practice is required. It is planned to hire an Instructor or Assistant Professor, full-time in the Division of Pharmacoepidemiology to strengthen our expertise in economic analyses, including cost and cost-effectiveness analyses, program evaluation, and policy evaluations with a focus on causal inference. Candidates should hold a relevant Ph.D. degree or a medical degree, incl. M.D., O.D., Pharm.D., plus a master's degree with research experience.

We are a world-leading research division at Harvard Medical School that studies the use, effectiveness and safety of medical products in clinical practice. We have direct access to large amounts of up-to-date patient-level longitudinal data from electronic health records and insurance claims. We have a portfolio of applied and methods-focused projects to understand the economic outcomes of medications and clinical strategies funded by NIH, AHRQ, PCORI.

An academic rank of Instructor or Assistant Professor at Harvard Medical School will be commensurate with experience, training and achievements. The successful candidate will collaborate and provide clinical informatics guidance in ongoing research projects, build their own research program, and engage in mentoring trainees.
