

Ataxia Center Faculty

The Department of Neurology at Massachusetts General Hospital is seeking a neurologist clinician-scientist with training and expertise in cerebellar ataxia and related disorders to join the Ataxia Center and the faculty of Harvard Medical School. Areas of interest include hereditary and acquired disorders of the cerebellum, and a particular interest in clinical trials.

The successful candidate will have an active clinical practice integrated within the MGH Ataxia Center. The ideal candidate would have substantial clinical, teaching and research experience, however less experienced candidates with exceptional promise will be considered.

The candidate will focus on the diagnosis and care of patients in the Ataxia Center and participate in teaching seminars and conferences. The clinical focus will be outpatient care. The candidate will have an opportunity to participate in programmatic leadership, and to work closely with medical students, neurology residents and fellows.

The successful candidate will participate in leading ongoing and new clinical trials in the ataxias, have a desire to reach national prominence in clinical trials, and view this as core to their career and academic advancement. Research interests that intersect with the demands of clinical care and clinical trials are encouraged.

Appointment as an Instructor, Assistant or Associate Professor along with a corresponding hospital appointment will be commensurate with experience, training, and achievements. In addition, it is expected that the candidate will engage in teaching in the Harvard community with a minimum of 50 hours required per year. Suitable candidates will have an MD or an MD-PhD, Board Certifications in Neurology, and fellowship training in movement disorders, ataxia, or cognitive behavioral neurology.
