The Dana-Farber/Boston Children's Cancer and Blood Disorders Center invites applications for a junior faculty member with strong clinical research skills and an interest in survivor care and investigation in cancer survivorship. The successful candidate will develop a portfolio of innovative research directed at improving long-term outcomes for pediatric and young adult patients who have been treated childhood cancer. The successful candidate will also be expected to take on clinical responsibilities in the survivorship program, as well as provide inpatient and outpatient care of pediatric cancer patients. Clinical responsibilities will initially constitute 25% of the faculty member's effort and could increase over time to approximately 50%, dependent upon available grant funding. Successful candidates will participate in medical education.

Qualified candidates should have an MD degree and be board-certified in pediatric hematology-oncology. Dana-Farber and Boston Children's Hospital are Harvard Medical School Teaching Hospitals. The chosen candidate may receive an academic appointment at the Assistant Professor rank at Harvard Medical School, commensurate with experience, accomplishments and teaching responsibilities.

The position will be based at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute (an NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center).

Salary offered will be consistent with fair market rate and commensurate with experience.
