



PSYCHIATRIST FOR BIPOLAR CLINICAL AND RESEARCH PROGRAM. The **Massachusetts General Hospital Dauten Family Center for Bipolar Treatment Innovation (formerly the Bipolar Clinic and Research Program)** is seeking applicants for a Psychiatrist (MD) position. The aim of the program is to evaluate psychiatric and psychosocial treatments for bipolar disorder, to learn more about the causes and general course of this disorder, and to investigate the pathophysiology of the condition with neuroimaging and other biological markers. The program participates in large-scale, multi-site, NIMH, industry, and privately-sponsored initiatives.

Working under the general direction of the directors of the Dauten Center for Bipolar Treatment and Innovation (DCBI) at the Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH), the psychiatrist (MD) will provide direct care to patients in a high-volume outpatient clinical service. S/he will develop, implement, and evaluate a program of specialized health care for a select patient population with Bipolar disorder. S/he will promote a collaborative relationship among various health care professionals toward continuity of patient care and efficient use of resources. S/he serves as a role model for professional medical practice in the management of patients with Bipolar disorder.

The psychiatrist will have the opportunity to be involved in a wide variety of clinical research projects. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, generating research ideas, developing, designing, executing, and interpreting research experiments. This position will also allow opportunity for contribution to the scientific literature and dissemination of research findings at all levels as well as development of new methods and technologies for research and clinical advancement.

The psychiatrist must provide evidence of continuing medical education and meet the metrics for an academic appointment at Harvard Medical School (HMS) at the level of instructor and will be committed to teaching medical students, residents, and fellows.
