

General Neurology with Stroke Experience

Mount Auburn Hospital, a Harvard Medical School teaching hospital serving the greater Cambridge, MA area seeks a neurologist with an experience in stroke. The ideal candidate should have completed a neurovascular fellowship or have experience in the management of stroke, but also possess a strong interest in all of clinical neurology. The responsibilities of this position are primarily to provide outpatient neurologic care and to develop an ambulatory Stroke Clinic. Inpatient and emergency care of neurologic patients would be expected one day per week. Weekend and night coverage will be in rotation with the rest of the neurology faculty. Medical education is a key responsibility -- the selected neurologist will provide education of attending physicians, medical residents and medical students by contributing to Medical Grand Rounds, Neurology Grand Rounds and all activities of the Division of Neurology. Candidates must be Board Certified/Board Eligible in Neurology.
