

The Massachusetts General Hospital Department of Psychiatry has an opportunity for a collaborative, flexible, and team-oriented licensed psychologist in an outpatient psychiatry setting.

The Psychosis Clinical and Research Program (PCRP) is seeking a licensed Psychologist with adolescent and adult psychotherapy and assessment experience to provide clinical services to patients and families (including adolescents from 10-17 and adults 18+) across the continuum of psychosis-risk and psychotic disorders treatment programs within the PCRP. The PCRP programs include patients with clinical high-risk for psychosis, first-episode psychosis, and chronic psychotic disorders, such as schizophrenia and schizoaffective disorder. These interdisciplinary programs provide individual therapy, group therapy, family therapy, psychopharmacology, and school and employment supports. The PCRP's programs aim to address psychological, psychosocial, environmental, age-specific issues in a culturally-responsive manner to maximize emotional, social, and physical well-being. Within the PCRP and affiliated programs, there are opportunities available to be involved in clinical research projects, dependent on Psychologist interests and fit.

The PCRP invites applicants qualified for an academic appointment at Harvard Medical School at the rank of Instructor or Assistant Professor. Applicants who work well in teams, collaborate well with colleagues, thrive in a fast-paced work environment, and enjoy engaging in clinical interventions, evaluation, consultation, and supervision of trainees will be particularly well-suited for this work.

Applicants must have a Ph.D. or Psy.D. in clinical or counseling psychology from an APA/CPA accredited program and must have completed an APA-accredited internship. Applicants with an Ed.D. will also be considered. Applicants must have completed sufficient coursework and received supervised clinical experience working with children, adolescents, and families to be considered.
