The Anatomic Pathology services collectively handle over 85,000 surgicals, 40,000 cytology specimens and 10,000 cytogenetics samples annually and is responsible for provision of pathology services at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute, where there are also ample opportunities for multidisciplinary collaborations, as there are at multiple other Harvard-affiliated institutions. Applicants should be committed to excellent patient care, as well as research, scholarship, and effective teaching.
