



LARYNGEAL SURGEON

The Division of Laryngeal Surgery is seeking BC/BE candidate for a full-time position in the Department of Surgery of the Massachusetts General Hospital, a teaching affiliate of Harvard Medical School. Appointment as Instructor, Assistant Professor, or Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School is available and will be commensurate with experience.

The candidate will be an active participant in the Massachusetts General Hospital Voice Center. Applicants for the position should have expertise in benign and malignant laryngeal surgery, airway pathology, voice disorders, and management of the performing voice. The individual will join a multidisciplinary team (voice scientists and speech pathologists) that has access to state-of-the-art voice clinic and laboratory facilities for surgical engineering and voice research. They will have teaching responsibilities for Harvard Medical Students as well as resident and fellowship trainees of Harvard affiliate programs. There are numerous opportunities to participate on grant-funded (NIH and private foundations) clinical and basic science research projects in collaboration with interdisciplinary teams of scientists and clinicians at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the Wellman Laboratories of Photomedicine at the Massachusetts General Hospital. The option to collaborate with local music conservatories is also available.
