The Division of Developmental Medicine in the Department of Pediatrics at Boston Children's Hospital seeks a full-time developmental-behavioral pediatrician to provide outpatient diagnostic evaluation and treatment services in the Developmental Medicine Center (DMC). The DMC is one of the largest clinical programs for the diagnosis and treatment of neurodevelopmental disorders in the US, and is dedicated to promoting research, teaching, and service innovations designed to improve the lives of children, adolescents and families. The DMC provides services for children from infancy through adolescence who present with complex neurodevelopmental disorders, including autism spectrum disorders, medical and genetic conditions, intellectual disabilities, and learning, attentional, behavioral and regulatory disorders. The DMC is involved in clinical care and research as well as the training of pediatricians and psychologists. Active participation in clinical and/or basic research is strongly supported and encouraged for applicants with research training and experience.

Applicants must possess a Massachusetts medical license prior to assuming the position and be board certified in Developmental Behavioral Pediatrics. Academic appointment as an Instructor or Assistant Professor at Harvard Medical School will be commensurate with clinical and research experience, training and achievements in addition to teaching activities.
