The ideal candidate will have expertise in the areas of Movement Disorders, such as parkinsonian syndromes, dystonia, tremor and have expertise in botulinum toxin administration and/or deep brain stimulation. Applicant should have a passionate commitment to clinical medicine, patient care, outreach, and collegiality. Hospital title will be Associate Neurologist and academic title of Instructor, Assistant Professor, or Associate Professor at Harvard Medical school will be commensurate with experience and scholarship in the field. Candidate will establish their own clinical practice within the Division.

The Division of Movement Disorders at the Brigham and Women's Hospital works in close concert with its counterpart division at the Massachusetts General Hospital providing exciting collaborative opportunities.

The successful candidate should be board-certified in Neurology and have fellowship training in Movement Disorders. In addition to clinical responsibilities, the role will include opportunities for clinical research including clinical trials, and teaching.

Appointment at the Harvard Medical School will be commensurate with experience, training, and achievements. The Harvard appointment carries an obligation to teach within the Harvard community a minimum of 50 hours per year. We anticipate the successful candidate will be qualified for appointment at the Instructor, Assistant Professor, or Associate Professor level.
