The Department of Pathology at Brigham and Women's Hospital, a principal teaching affiliate of Harvard Medical School, is seeking a research scientist for a full-time faculty appointment at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. This recruitment seeks individuals working in one or more areas that synergize with our Department's research programs and strategic plan, including but not limited to: disorders of immunity and inflammation; cancer pathophysiology and immunology; infectious and microbiome drivers of disease; cell and gene therapy; computational approaches to the study of human disease; and translation of research findings into novel diagnostics and therapeutics. Ideal candidates will have postdoctoral experience and a track record of outstanding scientific accomplishment and productivity that support their potential to establish a vigorous and impactful extramurally funded research program in the biomedical sciences. Applicants must have a M.D. and/or Ph.D. in the biomedical sciences and/or a related field of study, including quantitative disciplines.

The position comes with outstanding research space, a collaborative environment, and a competitive start-up package. The Pathology department features unique resources including high-dimensional genomic, phenotypic, and imaging data from longitudinal patient cohorts. Other departmental and institutional resources include cores for cellular phenotyping, genome sequencing, animal model studies, single cell sequencing, high performance computing, and computational analyses. The academic appointment will be at Harvard Medical School. Women and members of underrepresented groups are strongly encouraged to apply. The successful candidate will have ample opportunities to teach and mentor Ph.D. students, clinical trainees, and postdoctoral fellows at Harvard Medical School and Brigham and Women's Hospital.
