

## BRIGHAM AND WOMEN'S HOSPITAL ACADEMIC SURGICAL PATHOLOGIST

The Department of Pathology at Brigham and Women's Hospital, a principal teaching affiliate of Harvard Medical School, is seeking an academically oriented, Board-certified faculty pathologist with established skills in frozen section pathology, formal fellowship training in one or more surgical pathology subspecialities, and interest in clinical/translational research. The distribution of clinical service/patient care responsibilities will be focused in Surgical Pathology, with the potential to devote a significant percentage of clinical effort to a specific subspecialty in pathology, which would be tailored to the successful applicant's experience and career goals. The Department is staffed by more than 120 faculty and more than 60 residents and clinical fellows in Anatomic and Clinical Pathology in a predominantly subspecialty-oriented model. The Anatomic Pathology services collectively handle over 85,000 surgical specimens, 45,000 cytology specimens, 50,000 molecular tests, and 10,000 cytogenetics samples annually. The environment provides substantial opportunities for clinical/translational research as well as collaborations with investigators in multiple Harvard-affiliated institutions, including the Dana Farber Cancer Institute, wherein there are busy multidisciplinary oncology programs. Applicants should be committed to excellent patient care, as well as research, scholarship, and effective teaching. Academic rank at Instructor, Assistant or Associate Professor level and salary will be commensurate with experience and accomplishments.
