

PART-TIME STAFF PSYCHIATRIST POSITION AT MCLEAN HOSPITAL

McLean Hospital, America's top ranked psychiatric hospital, is inviting applications for a part-time (0.6 FTE) staff psychiatrist position at McLean Hospital in Belmont, MA. This position will be at the Behavioral Health Partial Program (BHP).

The Behavioral Health Partial Hospital Program (BHP) is a short-term intensive treatment program that runs Monday through Friday from 8:30am-3 pm, for an approximate length of 10 business days. The BHP serves individuals with a wide range of psychiatric conditions, including mood and anxiety disorders, depression, personality disorders, bipolar spectrum disorders, and thought disorders. The BHP offers medication consultation and treatment, group therapy, individual therapy, case management, and aftercare planning. At the core of our mission is an evidence-based approach that integrates Cognitive Behavior Therapy (CBT), Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), and Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT).

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

Provides clinical services including psychiatric evaluation, diagnosis, and pharmacotherapy

Collaboratively formulates individual treatment plans for psychiatric patients with a variety of psychiatric diagnoses, and manages ongoing care of patients

Leads weekly clinical team rounds

Communicates with other providers of mental health and medical services as appropriate.

Maintains contact with family members as appropriate.

Documents in the record by the completion of treatment plans, patient encounter forms, appropriate progress notes, clinical summaries and other documentation in accordance with hospital policies.

Provides interface with payers and managed care organizations through the completion of timely and effective reviews and necessary authorizations.

Participates in program and hospital administrative activities (e.g. staff meetings, CQI, hospital committees, etc.)

Maintains awareness of medicolegal/risk management issues.

Participates in hospital teaching efforts, including supervision, mentorship and teaching of interns, residents, fellows, and social work trainees



Qualifications:

M.D. degree (or equivalent as confirmed by ECFMG)

3 to 4 years formal residency education in a program approved by the RRC of the ACGME.

ABP&N eligible or certified psychiatrist.

License to practice medicine in the Commonwealth of MA.

Skills:

Experience in diagnosis, psychotherapy, psychopharmacology and other somatic therapies, the formulation of treatment plans and the conduct of patient-specific treatment programs. (May be obtained during residency education)

Experience in psychiatric inpatient or partial hospital settings preferred

This role requires flexibility, excellent interpersonal skills both with internal and external customers, the ability to function independently and to provide clinical supervision to other staff.

All employees must possess basic computer skills to use a variety of electronic or online systems for communication, clinical and administrative purposes.

Required to complete electronic medical records training and demonstrate 80% accuracy on competency test within 30 days of hire.

Position may also require being on call to the program.

Salary and recruitment package in accordance with Hospital policies, and a Harvard Medical School appointment at the academic rank of Lecturer, Instructor or Assistant Professor (part time) will be contingent on meeting the requirements for an HMS appointment and candidate qualifications including Massachusetts medical license, and being board certified/board eligible.
