The Clinical Director serves as the clinical and administrative liaison between VABHS and BWH for the program. This position includes clinical activities in cardiology and heart failure at VABHS and on the heart failure and transplant services at BWH. These activities include inpatient cardiology, advanced heart failure, mechanical circulatory support and heart transplant services, and outpatient ambulatory continuity care clinics.

The position involves teaching of residents, Cardiovascular Disease Fellows, and subspecialty Fellows in Advanced Heart Failure and Transplant Cardiology. The successful candidate should have a track record of research in clinical or basic research, quality of care or an equivalent academic area. Academic appointment at Harvard Medical School (HMS) as Instructor, Assistant Professor or Associate Professor will be provided commensurate with experience and accomplishments.

VABHS is the major tertiary referral center for Veterans from throughout New England and is strongly affiliated with HMS and Boston University Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine. The System comprises three major campuses and five community-based outpatient clinics. VABHS is the largest recipient of VA intramural research funds and ranks among the top VA facilities in total research funding.

The position requires US citizenship, M.D. with licensure, and board certification in Cardiovascular Disease and Advanced Heart Failure and Transplant Cardiology, and 3-5 years of experience in a high-volume mechanical circulatory support and heart transplant center.
