The Boston Children's Hospital Department of Pediatrics is seeking a board certified or board eligible allergist-immunologist eager to engage in clinical practice, teaching, and research.

The position, in the Division of Immunology, encompasses the full scope of inpatient and outpatient clinical settings, providing care for a variety of allergic diseases, asthma and immune deficiencies. The incumbent will join a group of more than 20 faculty clinicians and investigators and will be appointed to both the Children's Hospital staff and the Harvard Medical School faculty as an instructor or assistant professor. Teaching responsibilities will include didactic instruction and clinical supervision of medical students, residents, and fellows. Candidates interested in clinical research are also encouraged to apply.

The Division of Immunology treats more than 40,000 patients a year, both at the central campus in the Longwood medical area and at nearby satellite locations. Leading Boston medical institutions in the immediate vicinity include Harvard Medical School and the T.H. Chan School of Public Health. Applicants should be committed to providing care in a large urban environment.
