The work is primarily based at Newton Wellesley Hospital, Newton, MA, with an optional opportunity to spend 20% - 40% of the clinical time at Massachusetts General Hospital. Candidates should be board-certified or board eligible in Interventional Radiology/Diagnostic Radiology and have completed an Interventional Radiology fellowship or residency in an ACGME-accredited program.

The successful candidate will be capable of integrating into and building a clinical practice at Newton Wellesley Hospital. Newton-Wellesley Hospital (NWH) is a 273-bed hospital located in Newton, MA, approximately 9 miles from downtown Boston. The hospital is located at the intersection of two major highways, which allows for an easy commute from various locations in Massachusetts.

The candidate should be able to perform all types of interventional radiology procedures, including organ biopsies (including lung), drainages, urological/biliary/gastrointestinal interventions, arterial and venous interventions, dialysis access interventions, interventional oncology procedures, TIPS/portal interventions, and kyphoplasty/vertebroplasty. It is also expected that the candidate will actively participate in outpatient and inpatient clinical care, longitudinal patient care, attend interdisciplinary clinical conferences, and supervise and teach residents and advanced practice providers. Facilities at NWH include two state-of-the-art Philips Allura Clarity angiography systems, US, CT, and MRIs. The IR division is assisted by a dedicated scheduler and an advanced practice provider. There are growth opportunities for candidates at NWH, including participating in research and leadership opportunities in quality and operations. Strong interpersonal skills are expected to work collaboratively with referring physicians, nurses, and technologists.

The Division is actively involved in clinical and basic science research. MGH interventional radiologists collaborate with numerous clinical colleagues in oncology, nephrology, hepatology, and surgery at MGH and other Harvard University-affiliated hospitals.
