Inpatient teaching service time is available at BWH. Candidates should have a MA license to practice medicine and be board-eligible or certified in Neurology. They should possess a strong record of clinical expertise in the field of behavioral neurology, and should have a passionate commitment to patient care, clinical research, and teaching. A successful funding track record is an asset. Outstanding candidates at earlier stages of their careers will be considered.

Appointment at the Harvard Medical School will be commensurate with experience, training and achievements. Suitable candidates should have M.D. or M.D.-Ph.D. degrees. In addition, it is expected that the candidate will engage in teaching in the Harvard community with a minimum of 50 hours required per year. We anticipate that the successful candidate will be qualified for appointment at the Instructor, Assistant or Associate Professor of Neurology level.
