Candidates will be eligible for part-time or full-time appointment at Harvard Medical School as Instructor or Assistant Professor if they teach Harvard associated learners at least 50 hours/year, commensurate with qualifications, achievements and/or experience. The successful candidate will have earned an M.D. or M.D. / Ph.D. or equivalent and be BC/BE in Allergy and Immunology and Pediatrics.

Strong clinical demand and a growing research portfolio is driving numerous opportunities to participate in the multidisciplinary care of allergy patients and clinical research for treatment of these disorders. We offer a position with an emphasis on the outpatient care of patients with a variety of allergic diseases. The division of Pediatric Allergy at MGfC is committed to education as evidenced by the ACGME accredited Pediatric Allergy Fellowship program, a joint collaboration with the Division of Allergy, Rheumatology and Immunology within the Department of Medicine at MGH. As faculty, the candidate will be expected to participate in academic training of medical students, residents and fellows.

The candidate's primary focus will be as a clinician/educator, with the potential for involvement in clinical research for those that are interested. Particular interest is in the recruitment of individuals with expertise and interest in epidemiology, clinical effectiveness, informatics and/or translational science to complement a rapidly growing clinical and translational research program. Academic rank, salary and benefits will be commensurate with qualifications, achievements and training.
