

Psychologists sought for the Developmental Neuropsychiatry Clinic at Boston Children's Hospital

Boston Children's Hospital Division of Psychology seeks a full-time child and adolescent psychologist for our Developmental Neuropsychiatry Clinic (DNP) in the Psychiatry Outpatient Service.

DNP is a multi-disciplinary clinic specializing in assessment, treatment, and consultation for children/adolescents exhibiting psychotic-like symptoms, first episode psychosis; complex mental health needs associated with genetic and/or developmental disorders including Autism Spectrum Disorders, or severe behavioral disorders of unclear etiology. Since its creation, the clinic has sought to improve our patients' care through integration with research. The psychologist will provide diagnostic assessments, evidence-based treatments, and psycho-education to youth/their families, and collaborative consultation to community agencies and school systems. Collaboration with active clinic-associated research programs is strongly encouraged along with independent research opportunities. Participation in the psychology internship program is expected.

Successful candidates possess formal training in evidence-based treatment and have experience with these patient populations.

A Massachusetts health-service-provider license in psychology is required prior to assuming the position. Academic appointment at Harvard Medical School is likely at the Instructor or Assistant Professor level. Ongoing teaching and/or supervision will be required. Graduates of APA/CPA-approved doctoral programs and internships preferred.
