Boston Children's Hospital Neighborhood Partnerships (BCHNP) is a school-based behavioral health program in the Department of Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences at Boston Children's Hospital. BCHNP envisions a future where all students and members of the school community are thriving in a school environment that supports their behavioral health and wellbeing. We partner with school communities to co-create and sustain flexible, culturally responsive, and evidence-informed behavioral health systems that promote the health and wellbeing of all students, families, and staff. Our approach, research, and advocacy centers on the context of each partnership to provide preventive initiatives, training, consultation, and clinical interventions.

BCHNP is hiring a part-time (0.5) Research Associate to work as a member of BCHNP's Research and Evaluation Team developing, adapting, and implementing plans for documentation, evaluation, research, and dissemination related to program services.

Specifically, the Research Associate in collaboration with the Team will support:

- The development and adaptation of tools for documentation and evaluation, including qualitative and quantitative assessments, consent forms, and the medical record system.
- The conceptualization, proposal, and/or coordination of research and evaluation plans and studies, as well as mentorship of other BCHNP staff members in doing so.
- Complex quantitative and/or qualitative data analyses, as well as mentorship of other BCHNP staff members in doing so.
- Data dissemination efforts, including the development of reports that document and evaluate BCHNP services, as well as peer-reviewed journal articles and conference presentations and posters. This may include activities such as writing, preparing tables, charts, and graphs, and developing infographics or other materials.
- The facilitation of research and evaluation trainings, workshops, and activities to promote collaboration across BCHNP.

Appointment at Harvard Medical School will likely be part-time at the Lecturer, Instructor or Assistant Professor level. The position will require ongoing teaching and/or supervision.

BCHNP is committed to building a culturally diverse staff and strongly encourages persons of color and bilingual applicants to apply. To thrive in this position, you:

- Hold a doctorate degree in a psychology (preferably school psychology) and have completed postdoctoral training
- Are interested in and committed to program evaluation and research working in behavioral health and community or school-based programs with a social justice and racial equity lens.
- Have been a part of conceptualizing, developing, and/or writing evaluation and research plans and proposals (e.g., Institutional Review Board (IRB) proposals, grant and funding proposals).
- Have the analytical and critical thinking skills to analyze and present data, including proficiency in basic data management and visualization software (e.g., SPSS, R, Microsoft Office, Google Suite, Canva).
- Have the writing skills for collaboratively developing materials for data dissemination, including visual, oral, and/or written presentations of data (e.g., conference presentations, reports, manuscripts).
- Can work effectively both independently and within a group environment, and communicate effectively with others to problem solve and achieve goals related to numerous projects.
