The Department of Surgery in conjunction with the Slavin Institute at the Massachusetts General Hospital is seeking a full-time **Surgical Education Research and Simulation Specialist**. Candidates should hold a doctorate in education, psychology, sociology, organizational psychology, or applicable fields and have at least seven years of experience working with academic health professionals. Qualifications must include research expertise in quantitative and/or qualitative research methods, data analysis, academic productivity with first author publications in peer-reviewed quality journals and national presentations, teaching, ability to work collaboratively with health professionals. Other desired qualifications include mentoring others on educational projects and scholarship, acquisition of external funding, facility with database software, experience with artificial intelligence applied to education, and experience collaborating with surgeons and/or familiarity with surgical culture.

The candidate should be qualified to be appointed at the Assistant or Associate Professor level in an academic department of Surgery at Harvard Medical School. Salary and academic appointment will be commensurate with training and level of experience. As a faculty member of Harvard Medical School, the candidate will also assume teaching responsibilities for medical students, residents, fellows, and others.

Primary responsibilities include: Teach, mentor, and collaborate with faculty, fellows and residents on education scholarship, serve as Co-Director of the Surgical Educational Fellowship, tabulate all educational scholarship for the Department for annual reports, apply for grants/contracts for educational projects, innovate and manage on-line learning (D2L Brightspace) for faculty and residents, conduct clinical teaching and workplace assessments, and support the Vice Chair of Education activities.
