The Department of Radiology at Brigham and Women's Hospital, Harvard Medical School is searching for a new Full Time Division Chief of Nuclear Medicine and Molecular Imaging (NMMI). The Division Chief of NMMI will oversee all aspects of NMMI operations, including clinical practice, translational research, and education.

The Division Chief will provide a vision for the growth of the clinical, research, and teaching programs in NMMI. He/she will ensure state of the art clinical practice for diagnostic and therapeutic applications, and lead the QA/QI and safety programs. The Division Chief will be expected to oversee clinical research activities and provide academic mentorship to division members, as well as foster collaborations across Mass General Brigham Radiology and other academic departments. The Division Chief is also expected to provide overall leadership for our Cyclotron and Radiochemistry program, including all regulatory aspects of both clinical and research activities.

Academic rank is anticipated to be at the Associate Professor level at Harvard Medical School.
