## Overview

The HMS/HSDM/HSPH Ombuds Office (Office) was established in 1991 with the support of the HMS Joint Committee on the Status of Women to foster an understanding and tolerance of differences through education in order to prevent harassment and discrimination. In 25 years, the Office has served over 10,000 visitors. It now provides informal, impartial, confidential and independent assistance to members of the community in managing or resolving *any* issues affecting their work or academics. Services include conflict coaching, one-on-one and group facilitation, education regarding policies, procedures and resources, training design and delivery and reporting trends to leadership. These services are available to faculty, staff, students and trainees of Harvard's Longwood Campus schools and to Harvard appointees of affiliate institutions.
